It's going to take you a while to get through it all, since this issue contains 14 pages, the biggest on record for an SCR newsletter.


There are tons of results - from

Oh, and you won't find any Run Away From Results. Enjoy!








Buddy sez:


Club Notes

Are we being alien-ated?

Thought for today's lunch, compliments of comedian George Carlin: "If one synchronized swimmer drowns, do the rest drown, too?"

Musings on running, fitness, life, etc.: 3-53-43.

That is not a play called in the huddle by Brian Griese. It's also not the combination of the lock I use on my locker at the PCC Fitness Center. Nor is it the numbers of the finishing time of my first marathon in 1983, although it's pretty darn close.

(Note: The word "darn" is used in family publications like this when the writer doesn't feel he/she/it should be writing "damn." Do I always avoid using the word "damn?" Damn straight!)

Anyway, the numbers 3 - 53 - 43 above actually stand for the new American high school mile record of 3 minutes and 53.43 seconds that was set a few weeks ago by Alan Webb of Virginia in an other-worldly performance. Not only did it break the U.S. prep record set about three decades ago by Jim Ryun – who contrary to rumors is NOT related to Nolan Ryan – but it also lowered Webb's PR by 6 seconds. SIX SECONDS! And he ran his last leg in 55 seconds.

Now a 6-second drop by a schlock like me, who probably would have trouble running a half-mile today in that same 3:53.43 time, would be one thing. But to shave 6 seconds off a 3:59 mile PR is ... well, I can't even fathom it

I used the term "other-worldly" above because I've always felt that elite runners were not human, and this performance sort of provides more evidence. A recent *Sports Illustrated* magazine article about Webb and another prep running phenom — Dathan Ritzenhein — sort of struck a nerve in me that maybe they are aliens.

Judge for yourself. Webb was warming up for a high school meet in the spring and, to work out the kinks, he clicked off seven 400s in the range of 55.1 to 56.6 seconds with a 2-minute rest between sprints. Ritzenhein offers even more proof of alienhood. The article said he once ran 32 400-meter repeats at 70 seconds each and said afterward that "it wasn't that hard."

I asked Pueblo's premier "miler" this year – Shawn Borton, an SCR member who goes to South High and was 4th at state recently with a 4:33 1,600-meter run – what he made of all this. Especially someone clicking off 32 400-meter repeats at that speed.

"If I did that, I'd have stress fractures," said Shawn, noting that near the end of the track season he was doing, say, 12 quarters in the 68- to 70-second range.

"In my opinion, with a lot of young runners who are real good like that, it's natural," he added. "And when you get to that level, you're probably working out twice a day and you're ready for that (kind of workout). But it takes a certain body type, and I think you have to be bred to run like that."

Yes, hard work certainly plays a big part. But genetics – boy, that sure helps.

It also helps if you're an alien. 3:53.43. Whatta ya think?

Trail Notes

The elements win at the Collegiate Peaks

One of the things I like most about running is the lack of "things" associated with participation. You basically can get by with just your body – shoes are nice, but you don't even have to have them! Location doesn't matter because you don't need a field or a court or a gym – just a little open space. Weather and seasons aren't even a factor if you are tough enough. And best of all, you don't have to wait around for teams to show up or be picked. Running – the no-frills and no-excuses tough guy/gal sport!! And last month at Collegiate Peaks 25/50, I had the chance to prove it again.

I'm not superstitious, but early on there were some worrisome signs. The first was in the canyon on the way up Highway 50. Perhaps it would have been best to turn back rather then barely slip around the fresh pile of boulders on Highway 50 that would eventually close the canyon for a week. The huge rain and snowstorm were wreaking havoc everywhere. By the

time we reached Salida, it was buried in almost 3 feet of snow. Between the road conditions and longer drive up, I was tired before I reached the start.

Race day greeted us with another surprise: 10 more inches of snow and a change in the course. Normally it is a beautiful 25-mile loop through the hills east of town. It would now go up a straight road 10 miles and then back. You could go out and back once or twice for a 20/40 instead of the 25/50. Well, running in snow was nothing new, but the same course FOUR times? I run trails to avoid that type of self-flagellation. But being the no-excuses runner that I am, I was still up for 40 at the start.

The gun went off and we went off into the rain, sleet and snow – no mail, just total commitment. The temperature was a miserable 32 degrees: warm enough to melt and freeze simultaneously! The road surface was the worst combination possible: deep snow on top of thick wet mud. Within a few miles everyone looked like they'd been at the

wrong end of an elephant after an enema. It wouldn't have bothered me so much because I've run in miserable conditions before, but I didn't have Gore-tex shoes or waterproof gaiters.

In spite of the conditions, we trudged through the miles with stiff (i.e. frozen) upper lips and iron resolve. At mile 6, the bad conditions suddenly became worse. Waterlogged from sleet and splash, we were now confronted with a strong headwind. Living on the leeward side of the mountains, I know about wind. However, this was a

strong, nasty, cold wind, blowing down from the snowy peaks to the north. Without my Nike Dry-Fit running shirt, I was starting to look and feel like a chocolatecovered Popsicle!

Raw determination helped me overcome the cold, the wind, the mud and the snow and I finally trudged into the aid station and turnaround point at mile 10. Aid stations are always a welcome pick-

me-up with the cheerful people, food and drink. Unfortunately, they only had Cytomax to drink! I only train with Gatorade. If it isn't Gatorade I can't really drink it. I thanked the workers for the pretzels and soggy cookie, and then began the 10-mile trip back to the start, licking snow fakes from my face for moisture.

Hunkered down and pushing hard with a tailwind, I flew with unfettered courage toward the 20-mile, midway point. It would be hard, but surely I could make it out and back again. As I approached the start/finish, my wife stood solemnly at the side of the road waving. She is my greatest (OK, only) supporter. Her face reminded me of our conversation the night before when she "mentioned" how much time I was spending training for the 100-mile race. The finish/ start was just feet away: another 20 miles or stop now? I DNF'd. I wanted to run the same boring 20 miles of rain, sleet, mud, and wind, but I had to stop for her and our marriage – it wasn't my fault.

Runners shine in other locales

Area runners have had some excellent races outside of the Pueblo area recently. Here are just a few of them:

- Maddy Tormoen of Pueblo was the top overall female in both the Garden of the Gods 10-mile race (1:05:02) in Colorado Springs and the Horsetooth Half-Marathon in Fort Collins (1:27:56), and she was the 1st Pueblo finisher in the Bolder Boulder 10K (38:25).
- Speaking of the Garden, ex-Puebloan Chris Borton was the 4th overall male in 59:08.
 Chris also was 6th overall in the Sailin' Shoes 10K with a 33:44.
- Rich Hadley of Florence was 6th overall and 1st in his age division with a 39:33 time in the Armed Forces Day 10K. Laura Schilf of Canon City and Martha Kinsinger of the Springs were 1st in their age divisions. Martha also won her age division at the Garden and in the Sailin' Shoes 10K.
- Marv Bradley, 62, of Canon City also won his age division in the 5K at Sailin' Shoes in 21:19, and Woody Noleen of the Springs won his bracket with an 18:05.







Well, consider that 71,000 Americans are waiting for organ transplants, including about 1,200 at Colorado transplant centers. In 1999, more than 6,000 Americans, 63 of them in Colorado, died while waiting.

Jim and Nancy Martinez chose to donate their son Rio's organs to Donor Alliance after he was killed accidentally in 1997.

The Donor Dash 5K run/walk to benefit the Donor Alliance will be held on Sept. 2 this year in Denver's Washington Park.
