MINUTES OF FEBRUARY 2005 MEETING WERE APPROVED AS PRESENTED TO MEMBERS PRESENT WITH ONE MINOR CORRECTION

VICE PRESIDENT RICH HAD-LEY DID A MASTERFUL JOB OF CHAIRING THE MEETING WITH THE TEMPORARY AB-SENCE OF OUR PRESIDENT, GARY FRANCHI.

TREASURES REPORT: DAVE DIAZ REPORTED THAT THE CLUB CONTINUES TO BE FISCALLY IN GOOD ORDER, AND GROSS INCOME FOR 2004 WAS AT THE LEVEL THAT NEGATES THE NEED TO FILE AN INCOME TAX RETURN. DAVE'S REPORT WAS APPROVED AS PRESENTED.

The Side Effect of Running



Thought for today's lunch, compliments of George Carlin: "If you really want to put a faith healer to the test, tell him you want a smaller shoe size."

Musings about running, fitness, life:

For years they said Vitamin E had many therapeutic benefits. Then a new study comes out that claims it can cause some health problems.

Popular arthritis drugs Vioxx and Celebrex are hailed for helping people regain some form of a normal life. Later, new studies point out their real dangers to the heart.

Sports and energy beverages are universally accepted as boosts to training, competing and refueling. Now, it is pointed out that they can cause irreversible damage to dental enamel, potentially resulting in severe tooth decay.

The list goes on and on. Something is great one day, dangerous the next. If yesterday's study said something was super; today's research warns it can cause problems.

There are exceptions, of course. For instance, if a study ever comes out claiming that running causes, uh, loss of mental prowess, chances are that future research won't refute that. In fact, I'm wondering if this is what causes us to run marathons. Think about it.

Which leads me to wonder: Does running marathons cause reductions in mental capacity or does lack of mental prowess cause one to run marathons? It's an intriguing question, especially since our own Marv Bradley appears to be quite sane and rational despite having run more than 100 marathons or ultramarathons in his illustrious career.

It snowed that morning and it was perfect for a late afternoon run. The sky was patchy blues and grays, and the snow was soft in the 30 degree temperature. Big flakes were drifting ever so slowly from scattered clouds. After a half mile of snow covered asphalt, I took my first steps onto my favorite trailhead.

This trail invites you to partake. It starts off downhill and weaves around the chollas, rabbit brush and junipers sprinkled about the landscape. It leads through a small valley with rocky bluffs to the left and rolling hills to the right. The snowcapped Wet Mountains lay due west, straight ahead.

Stepping onto the trail is like stepping beyond a curtain. It is only a few blocks from houses, but these are hidden from view; so it looks and feels like you are a hundred miles into the wilderness. I have seen other runners and cyclists on the trail, but 9 out of 10 times, I'm alone.

Today's run is one of the reasons I do this. I'm not just observing beauty from a distance. I've passed through a magic door and have become part of a living scene — one painted by the Master Painter.

As part of the magic, the Spirit, Mind, and Body are freed from their normal limitations. Running takes less effort, and there is a feeling of buoyancy. Gravity takes a rest. The snow covered trail enhances that feeling – like that of the first skier of the day on a foot of fresh powder.

The day was still and there was no sound except for that of each footstep. Not quite a squeak. Not quite a crunch.

I became aware of the sound of each foot as it stuck the fresh snow. There was a rhythm, like a drum of an Indian in a not too distant village. Suddenly a line from a Robert Frost poem popped in my head. "The only other sound's the sweep of easy wind and downy flake."

It is from Frost's classic, "Stopping by

Woods on a Snowy Evening". In the poem, the only other sound was the harness bells of the author's horse. Mine was that of my running shoes striking the snow covered trail.

I've researched the poem and read several interpretations.

Some mention tranquility and solitude. Yes!

Some refer to beauty and mystery.

Some refer to a journey or transition. Yes!

Some think Frost was intentionally ambiguous about the poem's meaning. That he desired to invite the reader to discover his / her own interpretation. Makes sense to me.

Winter often symbolizes an ending, so my mind started to wander and think about endings. The great gift of endings, is that they are usually followed by beginnings.

The cycle of nature. The cycle of life.

My feet grew lighter and I was gliding more than running. I felt the softness of the large flakes drifting from the sky as they kissed my cheeks one by one. I heard my footsteps and the last lines of Frost's poem.

The woods are lovely, dark and deep. But I have promises to keep, And miles to go before I sleep, And miles to go before I sleep.

I'm not sure exactly what Robert Frost meant when he wrote those famous lines; but I know what they mean to me.

Rocky on Fitness

Rocky Mountain High

I want to write about something that has happened that is just incredible! And you have less than one month to take advantage of this for this year. What am I ranting about?

I am ranting about Mirkwood Basin, the brand, spanking new bowl that is now open to the public for skiing at Monarch. This area is gorgeous! I have skied in this area in the past as you could previously access it only via the snow cat tours, but it is now open to all!

Let me tell you a little about this area. To get to Mirkwood Basin, you take the Breezeway Lift to the top, and then there is a access path that you have to hike up to get into the Basin. I purchased a ski strap at the Edge a couple of years ago which allows me to sling the skiis over my shoulder, and I would highly recommend getting this cause it sure makes the hike a lot easier. Also, if you have a camelback type of water reservoir, take it as all that hiking makes

you thirsty! Anyway, plan on walking up the hill for a good 15 to 20 minutes, and you will be just blown away by the view. Up and to your left are cliffs called the Orcs! (whoever named this area was a fan of Tolkien's works obviously). To your right is Mirkwood Bowl with steep and deep powder runs most of the time. As you ski down, you get funneled into a ski trail which then gets you back to the main area and to the bottom of the Breezeway lift.

Mirkwood Basin is all extreme terrain, and it is advised that you ski with a buddy. I would also advise that you carry an avalanche beacon and know how to use it on heavy powder days. The ski patrol does cover this area, and access to the area closes everyday at 2:30 pm. If you want to take advantage of this area, you had better get to Monarch before April 3, as this is projected to be closing day for this year (boo hoo!)

I did three hikes into Mirkwood

Basin this past Saturday, and let me tell you, it was a great workout (maybe this wasn't the best idea as my calves felt like rocks during the Spring Run Off the next day!). The skiing was great: the south facing slopes had thicker, mashed potato snow, but the north facing slopes had great, lighter powder chutes.

Anyway, get out there and get it while it's good! I think the addition of Mirkwood Basin makes Monarch on of the best ski areas in Colorado! I just hope that word doesn't spread too fast and change the feel of the place too much.
