## The 2011 Spring Runoff

ow! If the Spring Runoff (SRO) was a commodity traded on the stock market - call the stock broker because we are going to make some money. Based upon the numbers recorded for the 2006 and 2011 SRO's on the SCR website, here are the 5 year trends: The 2M walk participation has risen by 49%, the 5k has more than doubled with a 120% increase, the 10k has seen a growth of 48%, the 10M was the "poorest" performer with a 31% increase, and the Funner to be a Runner is off the charts with an estimated 295% increase in participation. And, what a day! The weather was fantastic. Cool but not cold. Mostly cloudy, but no moisture, and only a slight breeze. This meant that a bunch of runners who were sitting on the fence and waiting until Sunday morning to decide - had no excuse resulting in a large number of race day registrations.

Now a few words on results. The majority of runners who attend are simply "average" runners who seldom make headlines but train, sweat, and push themselves to the limit. Many of these "average" runners give their all. And all is all - no matter what your finish time. Hooray for the mortals who gave their all - male and female, young and old!

I hesitate to make a list of exceptional accomplishments, because there are hundreds who deserve mention, but I will take the plunge and give note to a few.

There were some serious walkers who covered the 2 mile course in a very quick pace. Kathy Sutton, Donna Caporicci, Mike Kerrigan, Loretta Arguello, and Robert Quintana were the first 5 finishers. And they range in age from 48 to 68. Wow - these are some fit individuals. Living proof that it pays to keep active.

As far as the 5k goes, is it any surprise that Levi Medina (Mr. 5k - and I say that respectfully) finished 1:23 ahead of the 2<sup>nd</sup> place finisher Eric Stephan? And what a delight it was to see that the 3<sup>rd</sup> place finisher was a female - 14 year old Aubrey Till. Aubrey was an astounding 1:47 ahead of the 2<sup>nd</sup> place female. This young lady is going places and is the daughter of Calley Till who took 1st place in her division, and was coached by Rich Hadley at Florence H.S. a few years back. And how about Roger Giordano who took Ist place in the Masters division, but was 5th place over all. As a Masters Plus runner -I'm always glad to see a Masters runner compete with the "kids". Marti Marshall, the female Masters winner turned in a very respectable 24:25. A couple other notable performances were given by 50 year old Chris Riley and 66 year old John Roman who won their respective age brackets with times of 21:41 and 21:58. As Sundance said to Butch, "Who are these guys?". Finally a salute to 84 year old John Holiman who completed the 5k. Cool, very cool!

Now for the 10k runners. Andy Rinne was 3:18 ahead of 2<sup>nd</sup> place Rudy Castillo. Brandon Sanchez, Gerald Romero and Paul Koch founded out the top 5. Paul Koch was not

only 5th overall but took first place in the Masters division. Steve Cathcart, son of race director Terry, placed 7th overall. Steve has played some interesting roles over the years. One year, he shoveled snow on the trail, then took first overall in the 10k. Another year, when the 5k and 10k had staggered starts - he took Ist in both events. Sydney Mondragon was the Ist lady finisher with a time of 45:16. Sydney ran for Pueblo South and now coaches at Liberty. Vicky Granato was Ist in the Masters division with a 47:32 performance. Eight year old Kira Hughes took Ist in her division and finished in just over an hour.

Adam Rich, an elementary school teacher from Colorado Springs was Ist in the 10 mile, a familiar position to Adam who wins just about every race he runs. Bob Van Langerhoven from Ft. Collins was the Masters winner in the men's division. Stella Heffron was Ist overall and also won the ladies'

Masters division. Stella is also a very familiar face in the winner's circle and was a standout runner at (then) USC in the late 1980's. By the way, Stella won the SRO 10 mile race 20 years ago.

There are 1500 other stories, but obviously these will have to be told by those who laced up their shoes on the morning of March 6th, and ran the race. What a great event, what a great day! Tell your stories.

## **Great Stuff** — In Crisis Mode at the Runoff

#### Musings on running, fitness, life:

knew I was in heap deep do-do at this year's Spring Runoff when I pushed the starting button on the highly-technical, smarter-than-mankind Time Machine, a lapheld electronic results recorder, when the starting gun went off and ... nothing happened. Well, truth be told, I wasn't the one in do-do.
