Cooper River Bridge Run

When I go on a trip either for business or pleasure I always pack my running shoes. At least once I get up early and go for a 4-5 mile run. It allows me to experience the loca-

tion.....smell and breathe the air, greet the people who live there on their early morning walks and runs, and get a sense of the layout of the area. On a recent trip to Charleston, South Carolina, I not only ran on the beach along the Atlanta Ocean, I also ran the Cooper River Bridge Run. It is the third largest 10K in the country (behind the AJC Peachtree Road Race in Atlanta and the Bolder Boulder). It started in Mount Pleasant, went across the two mile Cooper River Bridge and ended up in downtown Charleston. It was incredible!

A heavy rain was predicted but we lucked out with only a light mist at the beginning of the run. The event has a large purse so many world class runners participated. The overall male winner ran a 29:01 and female a 32:57. In my age division (60-64), the winner ran a 46:33 (7:29 pace)! I was 12th in my age group of 618 women with a time of 57:54.

The purpose of the trip to Charleston was a reunion of five college friends. Two of my friends live in the area so it was the perfect place to get together. We were all Delta Gammas at the University of lowa a long time ago. Coming from small farming communities in lowa, our college educations opened many doors for us. Two pharmacists, a nurse, a dental hygienist and a speech-language pathologist (me) made up the group of women. Husbands also tagged along. We talked nonstop about college memories, books, trips, our families and, because of our age, ailments. The food was amazing......grits, hush-puppies, fried green tomatoes, she crab soup, crab cakes and a lot of steamed shellfish.

We are so fortunate that we run. It makes everything in life better!
